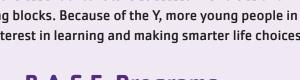

B.A.S.E. Programs

507 elementary students participated in our Before and After School Enrichment program (BASE) in 2024. BASE is offered at Forest Park and Prairie Lane Elementary Schools, plus our site at the Kenosha Y, which provides transportation to the Y from schools without an onsite BASE program.

100% of Caregivers are Very Satisfied/Satisfied with the Achievers staff, their child's progress, the program elements, and the overall impact of the program.

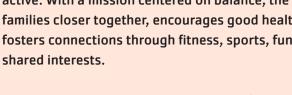

The Y has been responding to Kenosha's most critical social needs for over 90 years. Through the YMCA thousands of volunteers, donors, leaders, and partners are empowering people to be healthy, confident, connected, and secure.

Feeding Families

Our **501 volunteers** worked over **1,446 hours** preparing and distributing **900 baskets** containing **18,000 lbs.** of food in 2024, serving approximately **2,992 individuals** in our community.



Water Safety Kiosk

Together with the Safety Around Water Coalition, we installed a second kiosk at **Pennoyer Park.** This kiosk features critical messaging to inform visitors about hazardous currents near the pier and provides guidance on how to respond if they or others are in danger.



Empowering Tomorrow's Leaders

The Best Buy Teen Tech Center™,

powered by Jockey, opened in April 2024 at the Kenosha Emerging Leaders Academy. This free, technology-driven space gives teens ages 12–18 the opportunity to explore interests like music production, filmmaking, coding, 3D design, and robotics. Through hands-on learning and mentorship, teens develop creativity, confidence, and real-world skills for future success.

NASH AWARDS

The Nash Awards honor individuals and organizations that take Social Responsibility to heart and help to advance our core values of Caring, Honesty, Respect, and Responsibility. In 1928 the Nash family made a \$400,000 donation, toward a community youth center on the condition that residents match it dollar-for-dollar. Kenosha residents responded and in 1930, the doors of the YMCA were opened.



Patrice Hall Volunteer of the Year

Patrice "Patty" Hall, Kenosha County
Medical Examiner, has been a driving force
in water safety advocacy. Through the
Safety Around Water Coalition, she helped
connect city and county leaders, leading
to improved signage and the first SAW
kiosk at Pike River. Patty also spearheaded
the "Wear Your Life Jacket to Work Day"
campaign, engaging local government and
businesses in a successful awareness effort.
Her dedication and leadership have made
Kenosha's waters safer for all.

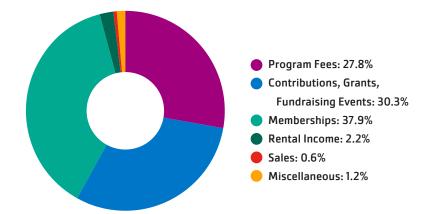

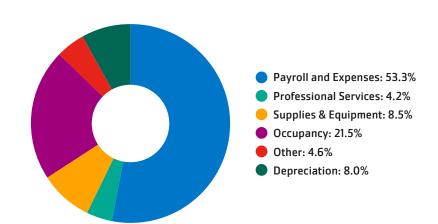
